A collaboration among the National Endowment of the Arts, Blue Star Families, the Department of Defense and more than 2,000 museums nationwide, this program offers free admission to the nation's active duty military personnel including National Guard and Reserve and their families through Labor Day.

The free admission program is available for those currently serving in the United States Military - Army, Navy, Air Force, Marine Corps, Coast Guard as well as Active Duty and Reservists, National Guardsman (regardless of status), U.S. Public Health Commissioned Corps, NOAA Commissioned Corps, and up to five family members. Qualified members must show a <u>Geneva Convention common access card</u> (CAC), <u>DD Form 1173 ID card (dependent ID)</u>, or a <u>DD Form 1173-1 ID</u> card for entrance into a participating Blue Star Museum.
