Cristina Pilar Acosta is a painter with a long history in Bend, Oregon. She graduated from Central Oregon Community College in 1984, returning there to teach art classes from 1991 to 1995. Pilar Acosta painted window signs for Christmas to pay for her Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from the University of Oregon in Eugene, Oregon. She returned to Bend, painting 24-footlong billboards daily at Carlson Sign Co. She skied, rode her horse, windsurfed, paddled and nurtured her family in Central Oregon. Her first studio and gallery was in an old box mill on Industrial Way in Bend, where Pilar Acosta manufactured her line of ceramic art tile, sold nationally through Ann Sacks and Home Depot Expo. She painted in her free time. For two years, the scent of Dani Candles soothed her as she wrote and illustrated books a few free evenings each week. Pilar Acosta practiced interior and exterior color consulting for 20 years. Cascade Middle School in Bend remains the same Bauhaus color palette she created 15 years ago. Now she's a snowbird, living in the Southern California desert, returning north for summers in the mountains. She continues to paint, write and enjoy the natural world.





Oregon printmaker and painter Midge Black is a retired registered nurse who trained at the Otis Art College of Art and Design in Los Angeles, California and Southern Oregon University in Ashland, Oregon. Her prints have been shown nationally and internationally, and she has work in private and public collections. Black's goal is to make art that she has not seen before. She believes her work succeeds when it calls for a second look because it inspires a new feeling or thought. "I find that art is a constant renewal. Making a piece of art or looking at art is a direct encounter with possibilities and imagination. It's like a walk, a boat ride or train trip, an everchanging view of our world and of ourselves." Black focuses on relief printmaking using wood, linoleum and experimental surfaces. She produces prints based on the natural world of the West.






Rudi Broschofsky's work sits somewhere between representation and abstraction. Taking a street art approach to Western art makes his process unique to both genres. His paintings are done in spray paint, which is accomplished through a calculated process of creating meticulous stencils with an X-Acto knife. Broschofsky's art is influenced by his upbringing, and art continually plays a key role in his life. He was spoon-fed Western art by his parents, who opened Broschofsky Galleries in 1987, when he was 5 years old. Growing up surrounded by a variety of Western masters ranging from Edward Curtis's iconic turnof-the-century photographs to Andy Warhol's pop art had a large impact on the subject matter that he chooses to focus on. Broschofsky is represented by several galleries including Broschofsky Galleries in Sun Valley, Idaho; Modern West Fine Art in Salt Lake City, Utah; A Rare Gallery in Jackson Hole, Wyoming, and Montana Trails Gallery in Bozeman, Montana. His work is part of the permanent collections at Traeger Grills Headquarters in Salt Lake City; Yellowstone Art Museum in Billings, Montana; Sun Valley Company's Warm Springs Lodge in Ketchum, Idaho and Wareham Development Medical Research in San Rafael, California.





It was there that he found his passion for painting and figure drawing. He graduated with a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree emphasizing graphic design. With a desire to serve his country, Cavin enlisted in the U.S. Army in 2006, and after serving for nine months, was honorably discharged after breaking his leg. During his time rehabilitating, he dabbled in other aspects of art, such as photography, tattooing (he's done most of his own tattoos) and sequential art. He began doing portraits of friends and pets. He finally felt as though he established an outlet for his artistic expression. "After years of being in the design field, it really felt good making something with my hands that others could connect to, appreciate, and that in return was self-gratifying." His work has been shown professionally for more than 10 years and has been honored at the Red Earth Festival in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma, and the Indian Market in Santa Fe, New Mexico.



His sources for feathers are through an extensive network of private aviaries and zoos. All are legal to have and sell. Most of the feathers he uses were naturally molted and many of the birds whose feathers he uses are still alive and well. Since feathers are three-dimensional, Maynard respects their form by setting them apart from their backgrounds so their curves and shapes are enhanced. The feathers cast shadows and change according to the intensity, quality and direction of light. Maynard keeps the natural colors and patterns of each feather.
