JOB SUMMARY

Volunteers at the High Desert Ranger Station interpret the history of U.S. Forest Service, the National Forest System, and the historic 1933 Ranger Station building. Ranger Station volunteers typically work alone and perform their entire shift in the station building. The Ranger Station is located adjacent to the main Museum building and receives fewer visitors, so this position is ideal for volunteers who prefer one-on-one conversations with visitors, deeper historical interpretation, and time to read between visitors. Guests to the Ranger Station include all ages who arrive on a sporadic basis throughout the day.

Ranger Station volunteers are not required to have current or prior affiliation with the U.S. Forest Service. The Ranger Station is open weekends from Memorial Day to June 30 and daily July 1 through Labor Day, 10:00 am - 3:00 pm. Volunteer shifts are typically one day per week, 10:00 am - 3:00 pm.
